Anna Akhmatova is regarded as one of the greatest Russian poets. Besides poetry, which constitutes the lion's share of her literary legacy, she wrote prose—primarily memoirs, autobiographical pieces, and literary scholarship, including her outstanding essays on Aleksandr Sergeevich Pushkin. Anna Akhmatova is the literary pseudonym of Anna Andreevna Gorenko. Her first husband was Gumilev, and she too became one of the leading Acmeist poets. Her second book of poems, *Beads* (), brought her fame. Born near the Black Sea in , Anna Akhmatova (originally Anna Andreyevna Gorenko) found herself in a time when Russia still had tsars. In , she married poet Nikolai Gumilev with whom she had a son, Lev. As her poetry from those years suggests, Akhmatova's marriage was a . Anna Andreyevna Gorenko, better known by the pen name Anna Akhmatova, was a Russian and Soviet modernist poet, one of the most acclaimed writers in the Russian canon.
